

## CHANGE OR STICK BACK A VALVE

**REPLACE A VALVE:** 1. If the valve is not completely gone, put the valve in boiling water during 5 minutes. 2. Undo delicately the valve. 3. If you cannot do it, or if you don't have boiling water, cut the valve to remove. No fear, the Wanikou adhesive valves are larger than the original valves which allow them to cover up the hole you just made. If the valve doesn't come off, you'll have to cut it.







4. The new valve is ready to be positioned. 5. Clean properly the bladder with some alcohol. 6. Stick back the adhesive valve checking that the bladder is flat. You can put the bladder back.







**STICK BACK THE VALVE:** 1. If the valve is not damaged, you can try to stick it back. Check that the valve and the Bladder are clean and flat. 2. Clean properly with some alcohol. 3. Apply a first layer of Bladder Glue on the valve and on the bladder. Allow drying for 10 to 15mn.







- 4. Apply a second layer of Bladder Glue on the 2 surfaces. Allow drying again for 10 to 15mn.
- 5. Put the valve back, checking that the bladder is flat.
- 6. Press tightly on the valve. Put a weight on it. Reinforce the repair with a line of Bladder Glue around the valve. Kits: Big rescue kit, Small rescue kit, Complete bladder kit, bladder glue.
